On this tour, you will see many of Jackson County's finest working farms, meet wonderful people and enjoy nature and beautiful countryside. We think you'll find the "living farms" in Jackson County to be enjoyable, educational and interesting.

1. Schneider's Nursery – 3066 E. U.S. 50, Seymour. As the largest nursery in Southern Indiana, Schneider's sells landscaping and garden plants. The Garden Center offers a variety of pottery and outdoor décor.

2. Shieldstown Covered Bridge – One mile north of U.S. Hwy. 50, turn right at County Road 200 North. This bridge was built in 1876 by J.J. Daniels and carried traffic until 1980.

3. Long Lane Farm – 1876 E. Co. Rd. 125E., Brownstown. Owned and operated by the Nierman family for over 140 years, the farm covers more than 300 acres and specializes in Brown Swiss Cattle.

4. Vallonia Nursery, Division of Forestry – 2782 W. Co. Rd. 540 S., Vallonia. Four and a half million seedlings are grown here annually. Sixty different species are raised on the 250-acre facility.

5. Driftwood State Fish Hatchery – 4931 S. Co. Rd. 250 W., Vallonia. This facility raises 250,000 two-inch bass, 20,000 four-inch largemouth bass and 8,500 channel catfish in nine rearing ponds.

6. Starve Hollow Lake – 4345 S. Co. Rd. 275 W., Vallonia. In this state recreation area, you'll find swimming, fishing, boat rentals and camping, a beach and playground equipment.
7. Tiemeyer's Farm Market – 3147 S. Co. Rd. 300 W.,

Vallonia. Tiemeyer's is well known for great perennials, annuals and produce and gourds, pumpkins and squash in the fall. The farm market features an ice cream shop and is a great place to stop for lunch.

8. Medora Covered Bridge – State Road 235, Medora. This bridge was built in 1875 by J.J. Daniels for a cost of \$18,142 and is the longest three span covered bridge in the United States at 434' long with 12' overhangs.

9. Stuckwish Round Barn – 4405 S. Co. Rd. 460 W., Vallonia. This barn was constructed in 1910-1911 at a cost of \$1,500 and was patterned after a nearby barn and has a central silo.
10. Stuckwish Farm Market – 4683 S. State Road 135,

Vallonia. Stuckwish's Farm Market is known throughout the state for supplying some of the most delicious watermelon and cantaloupe. The family farm boasts more than 300 acres.

13. Lot Hill Dairy Farm - 10025 N. County Road 375 E., Seymour, 812-525-8567. This three generational farm has around 100 head of Holsteins. Jon Claycamp makes his own cheese, offers gelato and even makes whole milk in chocolate and white varieties.
